The case for credentials

- Require demonstrated knowledge
 - Shows a commitment to have done the work to earned the credential
- Usually requires a measured amount of time doing the job (eg, PMI-SP = 5 years)
- May attempt to measure competence* (eg, RegPM)

The problems.....

- Knowledge was at a point in time
 - It may be forgotten
- Time served is not a measure of quality or contribution – how good is the person?
- Competency is measured in a context
 - It may not be transferable to another location




Scheduling Standards

- Project Management is evolving into a profession (slowly)
- There are a range of standards published
- There are a range of credentials offered
- Most PM job applicants now require a 'qualification' to be accepted for interview (but not for scheduling jobs)

- Practice Standard for Scheduling 2nd Ed.
 - Describes an effective scheduling methodology
 - Provides a quantifiable means for assessing the maturity of a schedule model Supported by tools such as Acumen Fuse

- Global relevance, for all industries
- Developed by working project controllers, supported by major global employers

Scheduling Issues

- Scheduling is NOT WORKING
 - Anyone can be a scheduler
 - Focus on tools not project outcomes
 - Focus on control rather than prevention
- 60% to 80% of projects run late!
- Incompetent tools dominate the market
 - MSP's default is to NOT move incomplete work after 'Time Now'/ Data Date

Scheduling Issues

- There is no benchmark training in the core skills of planning and scheduling
 - People employ schedulers based on tools

Scheduling Issues

· Consequently:

Organisations do not use effective time management and most projects run late!

Scheduling Issues

- The real issue is people
 - Training schedulers virtually stopped from the 1980s through to the late 2000's*
 - What training there was focused on tools
 - Assumption: 'Anyone can schedule'
- The situation is changing
 - The Guide + PMI Practice Standard & PMI-SP
 - International Guild of Project Controls (GPC)

 - Blending knowledge and demonstrated capability / competency
- But are we too late to change the current bad situation?

Credential Update!

- What we have:
 - AACEi PSP = Senior Construction/ Engineering Scheduler
 - PMI-SP = Senior Scheduling Manager
- What we still need:
 - Entry level scheduling certification focused on scheduling skills

AACE PSPTM

- AACEi's 'Planning & Scheduling Professional Certification' (PSP)*
 - 7 Hr examination
 - 8 Years scheduling experience
 - Construction industry focus
- Approx. 700 Certifications awarded
- Credentials available for 7+ years

The PMI-SP Credential

- PMI's Scheduling Professional credential
- Difficult 170 question exam
- Eligibility requirements:
 - Three to five years of project scheduling experience, and
 - A minimum of 5,000 (3,500 with a Degree)
 hours of project scheduling experience, and
 - 40 contact hours of formal education.

The PMI-SP Credential

- No industry bias
- No tool bias
- Only 600 awarded in first five years

The PMI-SP Credential

- Focus of the exam: Understanding and 'using' schedule information, scheduling +
 - Communications & Stakeholders
 - Risk and variability
 - Scope, WBS and Earned Value
 - Organisation structures
- Aimed at scheduling and PMO managers
 - & senior schedulers moving to management

Existing Credentials

- Focus on certifying senior schedulers
- Qualify 'experts' for
 - Litigation
 - Management influence
- BUT Senior schedulers don't value the credentials (500,000 PMPs -v- 500 PMI-SPs)
- Nor do employers
- · Why?


GPC - 'The Guild'




- The Guild is designed to support companies and individuals with:

GPC - 'The Guild'

Credentialing starts March 2012

- · Formal accreditation process will begin to go live
- Existing "members" of the Guild will now go through the formal accreditation process
- People with relevant professional qualifications can gain "Associate" level membership
- Confirmation of membership fees and their timescales

As the formal accreditation process is still under development we are not at this stage able to give you the full details of what knowledge testing and capability assessments you will need to undertake, however we can confirm the following:-

- ❖Undertake online testing to validate discipline and industry knowledge
- ❖ Validate skills, experience and useful 'on-the-job' capability via:
 - Practical written testing
 - Practical and useful capability exercises
- ❖Undertake a Professional Interview with a Regional Guild panel
- ❖A capability & experience overview with two Planning Planet / Guild referees

GPC - 'The Guild'

Key elements. The Guild will:

- Stay independent / not for profit / open book
- Use / recognise existing standards
- Use / recognise existing & future credentials
- Use independent examination providers
- Use knowledge AND capability benchmarks
- Offers a point of harmonization

Conclusions

- Should schedulers be certified?
 - There's proof effective scheduling makes a positive contribution to project outcomes*
 - There are no basic credentials at this point in time
 - Credentials set standards and drive knowledge frameworks (eg, PMP)
- My view is YES (as soon as it's possible)

Conclusions

- But, we need an effective management re-education program
 - SOX, etc mandate the need for predictive process like scheduling
 - So why do so many projects have time 'set in stone' before anyone looks at a realistic schedule?
 - Senior managers need to understand the value of skilled schedulers

Conclusions

- Solve the 'chicken and egg' conundrum
 - Well trained schedulers can help project managers and advise senior managers
 - But no one is training senior schedulers
 - Therefore very few people experience the benefits of working with skilled schedulers
 - Consequently they don't know what they are missing
 - And don't invest in training.....
